## **Doors Open Edmonton - A Small but Mighty Festival Features 25 Events**

**Edmonton, Alberta** – Through a series of cultural events, the **Doors Open Edmonton Festival** celebrates Edmonton's built heritage of old and new structures. The festival shows how landmark buildings and spaces contribute to Edmonton's development and civic pride. Doors Open Edmonton 2009 takes place May 23-24, 2009.

Adriana Davies, Executive Director and Editor-in-Chief of the Heritage Community Foundation, notes: "Our special buildings and spaces define us as individuals and communities. We must focus on Edmonton's essence – it's 'Edmonton-ness' that separates us from other cities - and celebrate that. The Doors Open Edmonton builds awareness of the City and how it has evolved and continues to evolve through time."

The Doors Open Edmonton Committee invites you to visit places of worship, tour the collection facilities of the Art Gallery of Alberta, visit the Francophone Quarter, watch a short film on the University of Alberta downtown campus, debate how place influences writers, hop on a bus for insider stories on landmark buildings, get lost and found on a psycho-geography tour, join a walking tour of the Poetry Trail at Louise McKinney Park hosted by the Works, take a Garneau Block Walking Tour with Todd Babiak and enjoy many other events.

Festival Producer Miki Andrejevic emphasizes that "the buildings we live in and the public spaces where we work and congregate shape our lives so we should preserve them both physically and emotionally. This is the way to build pride in our great city."
