Rationale

There are many aspects to globalization, which means that we accept close ties with the people around the world. This includes free trade and open competition of workers around the world with those from your own community. This could mean that local factories may close as workers in another country work for a fraction of the wage paid locally and raw resources from other parts of the world may be much cheaper.

In the same way, a resource like oil may increase significantly because of international demand and Alberta benefits as the royalty for oil extracted in the province is sells for much more.

Another implication of globalization is that all nations of the world are increasingly in agreement on what the basic human rights should be. This can be seen as agreements

about constitute a moral code that we will all live by. If there are violations of the declaration of human rights most nations in the world agree that those who are responsible must be held accountable and face trial in an international court.

Grade 10 explores the origins of globalization, the implications of economic globalization and the impact of globalization and the impact of globalization internationally on lands, cultures, human rights, and quality of life.

Globalization

Globalization can mean that we accept close ties with the people around the world. This includes free trade and open competition of workers around the world with those from one's own community. This could mean that local factories may close as workers in another country work for a fraction of the wage paid locally and raw resources from other parts of the world may be much cheaper.

In the same way, a resource like oil may increase significantly because of international demand and Alberta benefits as the royalty for oil extracted in the province sells for much more.

Human Rights

Another implication of globalization is that all nations of the world are in agreement on what the basic human rights should be. This can be seen as agreements about what constitute a moral code that we all live by. If there are violations of the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights* most nations in the world agree that those who are responsible must be held accountable and face trial in an international court. In cases where there are ongoing violations of human rights during armed conflicts, there is agreement that an international military force can be used to end the abuses.

Respecting human rights is necessary to assist in providing the basic standard of living as many of the defined rights protect individual's basic security, jobs, ability to speak freely, and to remain in their homes to mention a few.
