

POLICE ATHLETIC MEET JULY 28; DECOTEAU, WUTTENCE AND ROBERTS TO GO TO VANCOUVER

E. P. A. A. Choose Civic Holiday as Date For Sports—Program
Includes Nineteen Open Events—Three Athletes to
Compete For Dominion Championships

The annual athletic meet of the Edmonton Police Athletic Association will be held on Civic Holiday, Monday, July 28th., at the exhibition grounds. This date was decided on at a meeting of the officers of the E. P. A. A. held last night. It was also decided to send Alex. Decoteau, G. Wuttence and C. Roberts to the Dominion championships to be held in Vancouver in September as representatives of the Edmonton Police Association. Decoteau and Wuttence will compete in the distance events while Roberts will be entered in the weight events. They are three of the best athletes in Alberta and should have an excellent chance of winning a number of the Dominion championships.

This year's athletic meet looks like the best in the history of the E. P. A. A. There are 19 open events on the program and the best athletes in the city and province will be entered

in these. There will also be seven closed events for members of the police department only.

Following is the program of events:

Open events—100 yards dash, 220 yards dash, 440 yards dash, 880 yards run, one mile run, three mile run, pole vault, one mile walk, one mile relay race (teams of four), running broad jump, standing broad jump, running hop, step and jump, standing high jump, running high jump, 16-lb. hammer throw, 16-lb. shot put, 56-lb. weight, throwing the discus, tug of war (teams of four). These events are all under the sanction of the A. A. U. and will be open to registered athletes only.

Closed events—100 yards dash, for officers and detectives; 100 yards dash for officers or men, 200 lbs. or over; form; one mile races for constables; three mile race for constables; 100 yards dash for newspaper men.
